Proposal Form

To submit a manuscript for consideration by Lexington Books, please submit the following materials:

- The completed proposal form**
- A detailed table of contents**
- One or two sample chapters (preferred), or previously published articles in the same vein of research**
- Your curriculum vitae**

Send your completed proposal to only one acquisitions editor. View the [Lexington Books Contact Directory here](#). Please do not send your entire manuscript. If you are submitting a proposal for an edited collection we only require a complete CV for the editor(s), brief bios for contributors will suffice.

Please provide the following information:

1. Your name, email address, and professional affiliation.
2. The working title of your project.
3. A short description that succinctly states the argument of the book (1-3 sentences).
4. A detailed description of the book, what makes it unique, and why you are qualified to write it
5. A description of your target audience.
6. A list of competing or similar books (including publishers and dates) and how your project differs from them.
7. A list of courses in which your book might be used as a text or supplementary text.
8. An indication of whether any part of your manuscript has been published previously.
9. An indication if the manuscript is a revised version of a doctoral dissertation. If so, what changes you are proposing to prepare it for publication.
10. The length of the manuscript in 12-point type on double-spaced 8 1/2" by 11" pages.
11. If the manuscript is not complete, provide an estimate of when it will be finished.
12. An indication of whether the manuscript is under consideration by other publishers.
13. An indication if you intend to use any figures or tables. If so, how many?
14. The names, affiliations, and e-mail addresses of four to seven respected scholars in your field with whom you have no personal or professional relationship who could potentially serve as a peer reviewer.
